The RCPP Sierra Nevada Tree Mortality program requires a minimum of one dead or dying conifer tree within your 100 foot defensible space caused by the bark beetle or drought.

Upper Grouse Fuel Reduction Project 100 Acres Cal-Fire California Climate Investment/Fire Prevention Program



Additional work on the important Blue Ridge formation, protecting approximately 5,000 homes, and treating 100 acres along a portion of the Grouse Fire Control road and the Upper Grouse Road which runs into a United States Forest Service fuel project. Hand crews, chipping, and masticator treatment will be Used to treat 200' from both sides of the road.

Tri-Colored Blackbird - Poso Creek Department of Fish & Game



We worked co-operatively with a variety of government agencies to carry out wetland and upland habitat protections, restoration, and enhancement projects to benefit tricolored blackbirds on private lands in Tulare County.
