The RCPP Sierra Nevada Tree Mortality program requires a minimum of one dead or dying conifer tree within your 100 foot defensible space caused by the bark beetle or drought.

The Tulare County RCD was awarded nine projects by Cal-Fire for various types of fuel management. The "Badger Fuel Reduction" is one of those nine...







In the foothills communities Badger, Sierra Glen. of Hartland and various ranch houses comprised of approximately 100 houses located north and east of Visalia in a live oak chaparral vegetation type. Treating the Badger fire control road and a ridge line that ties into the road for approximately 75 acres treated by hand crews, masticator chipping, and 200' from each side of the road.
